## Details of Treaty are Announced at Capitals of European Countries

LONDON, Oct. 20 .- The Locarno security results were shown when seven treaties which comprise Europe's newest and most promising preventive of war were made public at the various capitals last night.

First and foremost on the list is the security pact or treaty of mutual guarantee, guaranteeing the inviolability of the frontiers between Germany and Belgium and also Germany and France as fixed by the treaty of Versailles. It is to be signed in London, December 1, becoming effective when Germany

joins the League of Nations. By the treaty Germany on her side undertakes never to tres- HUGE MEETING pass on the soil of Belgium or-France or to make warlike gestures in the demilitarized Rhineland area.

France and Belgium likewise promise not to violate Germany's Premier western frontier.

Should either party violate the agreement, the pact provides that Britain and Italy shall go to the aid of the aggrieved party.
