COW BAY WAS CHIEF TOPIC

City Council Defers Action on Joint Committee Recommendation Until Provinclal Government is Heard From

On the resolution of the joint We also have one with committee being read, Ald. Perry, square top about the same seconded by Ald. Larsen, moved that it be endorsed. Ald. Mc-Mordie felt that it was not necessary for the council to endorse the resolution in view of the fact that its purport, as far as the exchange was concerned, was already covered in the resolution passed at the special meeting of the council on Friday, Mayor Newton took the view, however, that the matter might be reaffirmed to which suggestion Ald. McMordie had no objection.

Ald. Casey brought up another! phase of the question as far as the fishermen's wharf and shelter was concerned. A suggestion made by George G. Bushby that a cove off Westview might well be used for a permanent tying up place for boats while Cow Bay might be used by boats merely such as the unloading and loading of goods had found favor with him. He felt that there would hardly be room at Cow Bay for the full requirements of all the boats. Before any further steps were taken by the council. he felt that it would be well to have some idea as to what the federal government was prepared;

Rush it Through

Mayor Newton was anxious that the Cow Bay project should! not be sidetracked. He did not want to lose the opportunity of getting a piece of waterfront in such a central location as that calling for commercial purposes now proposed. He urged that the resolution of the joint committee be endorsed as the best means of getting some immedi-

Ald. Larsen expressed the view that tremendous expenditure would be involved in developing! the site off Westview suggested by Ald. Casey. A fishermen's wharf at Cow Bay would not be such a large undertaking.

In spite of the fact that the council had previously agreed to the proposal for the exchange of waterfront in return for rights in Cow Bay, the mayor and a number of the aldermen seemed to think that that question was still under discussion and a good deal of time was wasted in repeating views that were voiced at the special meeting on Friday.

Ald. Casey pressed for some action on another site for the shelter of boats in addition to that at Cow Bay, which he felt might well be used for the purpose of a commercial wharf. Development, however, should not be confined to that point.
