Northern British Columbia and Manitoba got the jump on the rest of the country by opening their duck season Sept. 1. The latest shooting allowed in Canada is in the southern sections of Nova Scotia where the season closes Jan. 10.

Bag limit in most provinces is seven a day with 14 the possession limit, but Alberta allows eight and 16 and Saskatchewan 10 and 20. Nova Scotia has a l'mit of 100 for the season.

EXPECT BIG SEASON

Quebec expects more hunters than ever before to take the field, perhaps 90.000. British Columbia counts on 55,000. Ontario, where duck hunting areas are none too plentiful, looks for about 30,000 this fall. Wood ducks are fairly plentiful in Ontario this year but only one a day may be taken.

Highest cost of a resident licence is \$4-in British Columbia where a non-resident licence costs the same. Ontario and Quebec charge residents the least, \$1 and \$1.10 respec-

Non-resident permits are more expensive with Alberta's \$50 the stiffest fee and British Columbia's \$4 the lightest. Ontario gets \$21 from non-residents, up from \$15.50 last year, and Quebec \$5.25. Manitoba charges nonresidents of British birth \$10 instead of the normal \$25.


