

Famous Engineer Mine in Atlin District Working on Steady, Healthy Basis

The Atlin mining division, which comprises the northwestern corner of the province to the British Columbia-Yukon boundary, is showing a considerable renewal of activity and interest in mining. The placer-output of \$147,000 last year was about normal. No new placer-ground has been discovered, with the exception that upper Spruce creek is proving rich where bedrock can be gained.

The outstanding feature of the division was the resumption of operations at the Engnieer mine, which had been idle and in litigation since the owner, Captain James Alexander, was drowned on the Sophia in 1918.
