AMERICAN SMELTING AND REFINING CO. IS FINANCIALLY HEALTHY

Big Guggenheim Project Paying Dividends and Selling at Good Price

NEW YORK, Oct. 14.—No stock in the metal group has shown the price advance during the past year of American Smelting and Refining. In 1924 this stock was selling around \$57½. At that time dividends were 5 per cent per annum, and the income return just under 9 per cent. Today paying \$6 per share per annum, this stock is selling between \$108 and \$109½, the recent high. When the stock got up to around \$90 quite a few of the insiders believed it high enough and closed out a large share of their holdings. After the stock got up around \$101 or \$102 rumor had it that these same insiders accumulated new lines and changed their ideas as to the stock's value.

Due to the substantial property additions being made during the past few years, together with a much improved operating efficiency throughout the organization, as well as higher prices for silver, lead and zinc, to say nothing of copper, earnings are increasing very rapidly. For the first half of this year the company was earning at the annual rate of \$15 a share for the common stock, after taxes, bond interest, preferred dividends, depreciation depletion and all charges. This compared with \$12.60 a share earned in 1924. It is now estimated that American Smelting & Refining Company will earn more than \$10 a share in the last half of this year, and for the full year between \$18 and \$20 a share, which will be 16 per cent to 18 per cent on the present selling price, and more than three times current dividend requirements.

Extra Dividend

It is also intimated in quarters close to the officials that an extra dividend on the common, of perhaps \$1 a share, may be expected in the last quarter of this year.

CATALA INCLUDING ANYOX IN PORTS OF CALL DURING WINTER

Starting this week, the Union steamer Catala will include Anyox in her ports of call as did the Venture last winter. The Catala, which is eliminating the Surf Inlet call on the way north, will arrive here from Vancouver on Thursday evenings and sail for Anyox and the Naas River, returning here to sail for the south at 10 o'clock Saturday mornings. The vessel will also take care of the cannery service which is now curtailed. The Venture will do Surf Inlet along with her regular Bella Goola service.
