MINE BONDED AT SMITHERS

B.C. Silver Takes Over Schufer Claims at Large Price and Will Work Them

RICH ORE IN BABINES
Work Being Done on Manson Creek in Northern Interior With Good Results

Recent advices from the interior from which communication has been cut off except by way of Vancouver, state that many important announcements have been made which seems to indicate that mining is to be the chief interest of the coming year.

One of these announcements is that the Schufer claims on Hudson Bay Mountain have been purchased under option terms by the British-Canadian Silver Corporation for \$110,000. This is the property examined during the past summer by C. A. Banks and Major North. It is understood that work on the claims will be commenced as early as possible in the spring.

It is further announced by Paddy Higgins, owner of the Silver King, in the Babine Range that he has struck the main vein on his property and opened up some very high grade silver-lead ore and the ore holding strong on a twenty foot drift with a thickness of four and a half feet. A car load of the ore is to be shipped just as soon as it can be packed out.

Reports also arriving from Mapson Creek that R. H. Fleming of Portland and W. M. Ogilvie of Ottawa have met with encouraging success in connection with their properties which have been worked this season. V. A. James, an Ontario man, has also staked ground on Manson Creek and on Takla Lake which he intends to work.

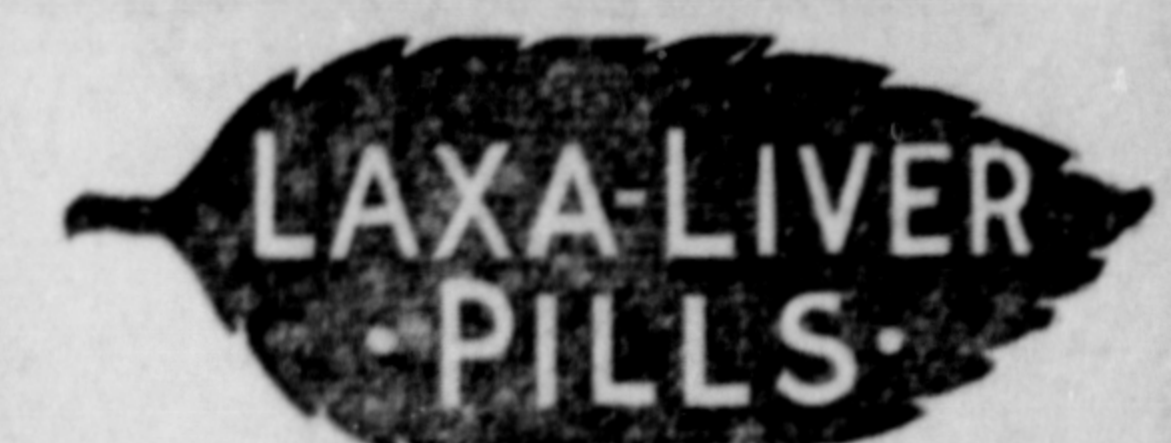

REPORT MADE CASSIAR MINES

Official of Geological Survey Announces \$7,500 in Gold Produced During Season

CRUDE METHODS USED

(Official Report)
About \$7,500 in gold was produced, according to W. A. Johnston of the Geological Survey of Canada, from placers on Goldpan Creek, Cassiar, British Columbia, during the summer of 1925. It was on Goldpan Creek that the find was made in the autumn of 1924 that led to the rush into this district in the spring of 1925. This creek is a tributary of Little Eagle River, and lies eleven miles in a direct line due east of the head of Dease Lake.

All the mining was done by hand as in the seventies when the Cassiar district was the scene of considerable activity. Nearly all the gold was obtained from the lower part of the creek from the Discovery claim, one thousand feet long, and from claims No. 1 above and No. 2 below each two hundred and fifty feet long. The creek was mined out for a length of five hundred and sixty-five feet, the ground averaging three to five feet in depth. Some gold was found in the upper parts of the creek, which is nearly four miles long, and on its tributaries, but apparently not in sufficient quantities to pay for working by hand methods.

Prospecting

Considerable prospecting was done in other parts of the region and extended as far north as Frances Lake, east to Muddy River and in the west on the first north fork of Clearwater River. One party of prospectors used a hydroplane for moving from one part of the region to another, as well as for flying in and out of the country. Late in the autumn, a discovery of glacial gold on low benches in the canyon of the first north fork of Clearwater River, about twenty-five miles above the mouth of the Clearwater, was reported, and a number of prospectors went into the area. No information is available as to the importance to be attached to the new discovery.

Machinery Taken In

Machinery including a drag-line scraper outfit, over thirty tons of hydraulic pipe, and a Keystone drill for mining and prospecting on Dease, Thibert and McName creeks, on which most of the mining was done in the early days, were taken into the district last summer, so that although the Cassiar placer field is an old one, and has produced very little gold in recent years, the past summer has witnessed a marked revival of interest in the possibilities of the region.

STEWART

Extensive development work is to be undertaken in the near future on the Lakeview property in the Glacier Creek district announced R. F. Hill, manager, who left last week for Revelstoke where he will take charge of the Woodsey group for the Bernier Metals Corporation, a United States concern. He has been retained in a consulting capacity by the Lakeview Company and will visit the property frequently as the need arises.

The Stewart Board of Trade, after a conference last week with Ernest Love, manager of the Stewart Light Co., passed an appropriation to cover the installation of street lights in town.

Plans and specifications are being prepared by the federal department of public works for dock extensions here. An appropriation to cover the work will be sought at the next session of parliament.
