And then again nobody has the least cause to cavil about the way in which she can and will doff all the streamers and roll the delicious crust of some home made apple pie. At fashions she is dapper. At household affairs she comes pretty high being a perfect caper. And there you are."

The Prefect of Florence and the secretary of the Fascists of Rome have been dismissed, and a purging of the wild men in local branches is promised. Meanwhile a typical example of the dictator's sensitiveness to criticism is to be found in an astonishing letter which, according to the "Action Francaise," Mussolini has addressed to Mr. Baldwin, rebuking him like an angry schoolmaster for a perfectly courteous reference in a recent speech to the unsuitability of the present Italian mode of government to this country. The tirade is not at the moment officially confirmed, but it is in the authentic tone to which this rather testy autocrat has accustomed us.
