# AIRPLANE MAPS OF MANITOBA

Dominion Government Making Aerial Survey of That Part of Country

WINNIPEG, July 18.—When the last seaplane is shipped from Montreal by the end of June, there will be 16 planes engaged in forest patrol and photographic survey work in the northern portions of Manitoba. There are at present nine in the service, which is carried on by the Dominion department of the interior. The new machines are being specially built by the Vickers company, Montreal, and will be of the most up-to-date type. While the aircraft commissioned for service in Manitoba last year made flights from eastern Canada, the planes now being constructed will be shipped west by train, after being put through a thorough test.

The photographic survey which was started last year when Major Hobbs covered the Reindeer Lake country, will be continued, and the photographers are concentrating on territory east of Lake Winnipeg and on both sides of the Nelson river as far north as
