Health Changes Hurt Dentists

CARDIFF, Wales (P) — Before new charges were imposed upon Britain's health service last June, some dentists were making as much as \$12,000 a year. At the annual convention here of the British Dental Association a statistical report disclosed that under prevailing arrangements the average gross amounts paid to dentists were only about half what they were in 1949. "Some are earning no more than in 1939," the report said. "In many industrial parts of the country dentistry has definitely passed from a boom to a slump period."

Association members charged that earnings had been greatly reduced following the 28 percent reduction in dentists' fees, saddling patients with half the cost of dentures and the recent imposition of a basic £1 charge for dental treatment for adults. Since the changes were introduced there had been an important drop in attendances, said A. P. Husband, chairman of the association's executive council.

It was believed in the profession, he said, that the £1 charge was a retrograde step. He believed it placed an unfair burden on the regular patient wishing to keep his teeth in good order.

"In the long run it will cost the country more ill-health," he said.

A Glasgow dentist who earned £300 a month when the plan began reported that his earnings dropped to £40 in the first month of the new scale.

'Different Situations' Throw Mr. Muzzy For Loss

After some weird bidding, Mr. Muzzy landed in a contract of three no-trump. The opening lead by Mr. Dale was the four of hearts. Mrs. Keen won with the ace and returned the eight.

Mr. Muzzy covered with a nine and Mr. Dale was in with the jack.

He figured the true situation in hearts and made a good shift to the jack of clubs. Mrs. Keen played the six and Mr. Muzzy won with the queen.

After much thought he came to the conclusion that in order to make nine tricks he would have to bring in the diamond suit without loss. More thinking, then out came the deuce of diamonds.

When Mr. Dale played low, the nine was put in from dummy and Mrs. Keen won with the 10 and returned her last heart. Now Mr. Muzzy could win eight tricks but no more.

"You bid the hand like a madman," commented Mr. Champion, "but, as the cards lie, you can actually make it. Your best play to bring in five diamond tricks is to lead the jack first—not the small one. Assuming Dale covers with the queen, you win with the king and Mrs. Keen drops the eight spot."

"Admittedly, you now have to make a good guess and cash the ace of diamonds rather than finesse for that card. But the way you played it, you were going to lose the first trick in the suit if Mrs. Keen had EITHER the queen or the 10."

"Didn't you just tell me on the last hand," retorted Mr. Muzzy, "to lead the smallest
