Power Plant and Tram Line to Work in Connection With Mill Which is to be Installed

STEWART, Nov. 18.—Dalby B. Morkill, who went south a few days ago completed the survey of a mill site and tram line at the Dunwell mine before leaving. The power for operating the mill! will be generated by two 200 horsepower internal combustion crude oil engines.

Work during the winter will consist chiefly in blocking outli ore so that by the time the mill is ready there will be plenty of ore to keep it running.


