when the report points out, it will require a little more than twice the surplus production of the district to supply the whole milk trade at Prince Rupert alone, to say nothing of Anyox Stewart or Ocean Falls.

**Publicity Needed**

Among the recommendations accompanying the report is one calling for the publication of the result of the survey and its general distribution in this district. Copies of the report are in the hands of the committee.

The question of aerial reconnaissance was discussed at the meeting of the Board of Trade last night. It was decided to keep the matter before the provincial government and will be again taken up with them early next year.

gathering data over the wide area comprised in the survey. According to the report, which is made up from the investigation sheets, there are at present 488 cows in the district, of which 140 are required for the needs of the farm and 99 for the supply required by the towns of Telkwa, Smithers, Hazelton and Terrace, leaving the production of 249 cows to supply the needs of Prince Rupert for whole milk, sweet cream and ice cream. The milk production of the 249 cows is estimated at 165,454 gallons.
