LUMBERING IS ACTIVE

Prince Rupert District is Busier Than For Some Seasons Past

Despite the fact that market conditions are not all that they might be, there is more activity this season in the lumber trade in Prince Rupert district than there has been for some seasons past.

The Prince Rupert Spruce Mill is working steadily with a production of well over 100,000 feet per day. As one goes eastward along the Canadian National Railway from Prince Rupert to Smithers, operations are to be seen at the George Little Mill, Terrace; Skeena River Lumber Co.'s and Hayward mills at Esquimalt; Royal Mill at Hanall; Pohle Mill at Garabaly and the Hudson Bay Mountain Lumber Co.'s mill just west of Smithers. In the Prince George area, there is also considerable activity, the mill at Giscome being the largest individual plant in operation. In addition to these named, there are a number of smaller plants cutting for local demand.

The Hansen Timber & Lumber Co. is also getting out a large number of poles between Prince Rupert and Hazelton for the United States market. There are camps and assembly yards at several points and, for the first time, one going through the district may see this company's piles of poles on the opposite bank of the Skeena River assembled to be floated down to the assembly yards at Cedarvale and Phelan.
