

Corporal Anderson Bids City Farewell After Long Service

A veteran British Columbia policeman and one of the most popular men ever to head the city detachment here, Corporal Ed Anderson, is leaving tomorrow for Kelowna.

The 230-pound former defence player with Kimberley Dynamiters' hockey club, and son of Magistrate Anderson of Kamloops, will be succeeded by Corporal W. W. McLeod of Lethbridge.

"Big Ed," as he is known among the other members of the force, joined the former B.C. Police force at Nelson in 1934 and worked in various interior centres before his transfer to Prince Rupert in 1945.

He was attached to the district office here and spent some time on the police boat before becoming a member of the city detachment.

When the B.C. Police were absorbed by the RCMP two years ago Corporal Anderson was second in command to Sergeant Lance Potterton, who retired recently, and later served under Sergeant Art Wales, who has been transferred to Cranbrook.

He has been acting head of the city detachment since Sergeant Wales left.

During his police work here, he has been instrumental in solving a number of major crimes. He was appointed a

corporal a year ago last May. Members of the force made a presentation to the Corporal at one of several farewell gatherings this week.

Corporal Anderson is married and has three children, 13-year old Louise and two boys, Charles, 11, and Doug, seven.
