LCNDON, Aug. 22. - An unauthorized strike of seamen sailing under the British flag has declared Sir Henry Thornton, begun in London and at other British ports. At present it involves 15,000 men. In London alone 35 vessels are tied up.

The cause of the strike is the refusal of the seamen to accept a reduction of a pound a month in their wages as recently agreed upon between the unions and the employers.
