Mr. Justice D. A. Macdonald arrived on the Prince Rupert this morning from the south to preside over the adjourned session of the Supreme Court Assizes which opened this morning.

After spending over a day discharging cement at the elevator wharf, Coastwise Steamship & Barge Co.'s steamer Griffco and the barge she had in tow cleared at 8 o'clock last evening for Anyox.

Two small boys, aged 10 and 12, appeared before Magistrate McClymont this morning charged with breaking and entering the premises of Douglas Sutherland on First Avenue. They were remanded until Monday.

Jarvis McLeod, collector of customs, returned on the Prince Charles this morning from a trip to Stewart on official business. J. E. Miller, customs inspector, also returned from Stewart and will proceed through to Vancouver.

One of the scows used in towing gravel for the elevator work here went adrift from the elevator during the night and was this morning picked up between the Georgia and Barrett Rocks by the tug R.F.M. which was coming from Hastings Arm with two gravel laden scows.

ARMCHAIRS FOR THOSE WHO RIDE IN AIRPLANE

Body is Buoyant and Watertight and Would Float is Dropped into Sea

LONDON, Aug. 18.—A single 560 horsepower engine airplane to seat 14 passengers recently completed its trials and will be used in the cross channel service. It has a large roomy cabin with wicker armchairs for the passengers who will have a constant supply of fresh air by means of special ventilation. Emergency exits are provided in the room should it be necessary for passengers to emerge in case of landing on the sea, in which case the wheels, axle and under carriage struts can be dropped by means of a lever in the pilot's cockpit. The body of the machine is watertight and buoyant and would float for several hours.
