DROWNED BOY BODY FOUND

Little Willie Smith Fell into Deep Water When Standing on Culvert

The body of seven year old William Smith, son of Mr. and Mrs. William Smith, Hays Cove Circle, who was drowned yesterday at 12.30 noon when he fell off the culvert on the dry dock embankment while fishing, was recovered in seven feet of water about 25 yards from where he fell in by City Police Constable Potterton and Dominion Constable Nutt at 4 o'clock yesterday afternoon.

As the tide receded, the body was noticed on the bottom by a man from the dry dock who was assisting the officers. Immediately it was brought to the surface artificial respiration methods were applied by P. B. Ashbridge, dry dock first aid man, and M. L. Stepp, U.S. customs officer. These proved ineffectual owing to the long submersion and life was declared extinct by Dr. J. P. Gade and Dr. J. A. West, who arrived on the scene on being notified.

According to Malcolm Smith, five year old brother, the boy was standing on the culvert when he overbalanced and fell in the water. Struggling for a while, he sand and the younger lad rushed home to tell his mother. It was thus half an hour before

EDMONTON MAY KEEP NON-RESIDENTS OUT OF HER HIGH SCHOOLS

EDMONTON, Aug. 19.—At a meeting of the Edmonton public school board it was decided to notify all high school students attending in the city who are non-residents that the board will reserve the right to reject any applications for admission by non-resident students if their number exceeds that for which the board is able to provide accommodation under present conditions.

The action arose from a controversy which the board has been carrying on with the department of education regarding possible help from the government in the matter of collecting fees from non-resident pupils, which the latter has refused. In view of that fact, it was decided that it would be inadvisable at the present time to extend school accommodation to provide for the ever-increasing number of non-residents seeking to gain admission.

Flying Ace Thinks Airships 3,000 Feet Long Will Travel 500 Miles an Hour

KANSAS CITY, Aug. 19.—Edward Rickenbacker, former motor car racer and world war flying ace, delved into the future of air travel, in an address yesterday before the Advertising Club. Here are some of the things he forecasted:

Airships 3,000 feet long, travelling on a trade wind 50,000 feet above the earth at 500 miles an hour.

Ocean crossing dirigibles giving one day service from New York to Paris.

Airplanes, carrying freight and passengers, flying across the United States in a day, regularly.

Dirigibles with a cruising period of a year.

Air-lines criss-crossing the United States.

RIFT IN THE LUTE

Children of French Mother Object to German Stepmother With Disastrous Results

WINNIPEG, Aug. 19.—After burying two wives, the second of whom was a Frenchwoman, G. T. H. Hoskins of this city took unto himself a third, a widow whose German nationality was obscured by her married name of Annie Goodman. Hoskins has three children, the widow one. The match was arranged with the assistance of a "marriage by mail" expert. The ceremony took place in May this year.

In police court Hoskins was charged by his wife with non-support and ordered to pay \$10 a week, which he said was an agreeable way out to him. It was pointed out that the marriage had gone well until one day Hoskins came home from work and discovered the children of his French wife fastened up in the cellar. They had crossed an imaginary Rhine, it was said, en masse and out for reparation. Resenting the discrimination shown Hoskins rebuked his wife, whereupon she answered back. The rift in the lute widened to a large rent, blood proved thicker than a marriage license, and the pair and their respective progeny split up and lived apart.

HAILSTONES LARGE HEN'S EGGS FELL

BUCHAREST, Aug. 19.—Heavy damage to property was caused recently in the region of Galatz, when during a storm hailstones as large as hen's eggs fell. The storm extended along the River Sereth into the provinces of Besarabia, Dobruja, Teleca and Kustendje.

In addition to the property damage crops were destroyed in several places.

LONDON, Aug. 19.—Scorching motorists are being frowned on by London magistrates. During the first three months of this year 2,573 were prosecuted in the Metropolitan district for speeding, of whom 2,510 were convicted.

All the accused arrived from Okalla Prison in charge of police officers on the steamer Prince Rupert today.

The same jurymen who acted at the opening of the Assizes in June have been retained for this adjourned session.

On court convening after the arrival of Mr. Justice D. A. Macdonald from the south on the steamer Prince Rupert, His Lordship charged the Grand Jury in the various cases and asked that it return with its finding in the case of Rex vs. Pena at 2 o'clock this afternoon. The petit jury was also excused until that hour.

The Lland River murder cases were also put in the hands of the Grand Jury. The accused in this case are named Big Alex, Dan Loo, Jim Loo, Clem Loo and Edie, the last mentioned being a woman A161 or Moccasin in the name of the native whom they are charged with killing.

VICTORIA, Aug. 19.—Premier W. L. Mackenzie King will not visit British Columbia this autumn, according to Hon. J. H. King, minister of public works, but he will be here next year. Should there be no election this fall several of the ministers will be on the coast for a visit. In any event Dr. King will be here again and will then tour the province, holding meetings at all the important centres.
