## BLACKWOOD on Bridge

**'Always' Is Dangerous When Applied To Bridge**  
Here is another situation where Mr. Champion's "teaching" cost him plenty. He has been telling Mr. Muzzy that where you have two suits to be set up at a no trump contract, the suit to go after first is always the longer one.

And Mr. Champion knows it. He purposely uses it when talking to Mr. Muzzy for the sake of emphasis.

Actually, the word "always" should never be used in a connection with any bridge situation. Oups, there I go doing it myself. What I mean, of course, is ALMOST never.

In today's deal, Mr. Dale opened the six of spades. Mr. Muzzy was elated as this gave him three sure spade tricks. He played low from dummy and killed Mrs. Keen's queen with the ace.

Laboriously counting his winners, he found that he had just eight, three spades, four diamonds and the ace of clubs. Where was the ninth trick coming from? Well, Mr. Champion had said to go after the longer suit first. There were eight clubs in the two hands and only six hearts. So at trick two Mr. Muzzy led a club and finessed dummy's 10.

Mrs. Keen won with the jack and returned a spade. Dummy's king won and Mr. Muzzy came to his hand with the ace of diamonds and finessed the queen of clubs. When this lost, his last spade stopper was knocked out and he had no further chance for three tricks.

"You beat yourself at the second trick," snarled Mr. Champion. "Why not start on hearts instead of clubs? Even lead a heart from your own hand."

"But you told me..." began Mr. Muzzy.

"No matter what I told you," Mr. Champion interrupted, "it

doesn't apply here. Dale had the danger suit, spades. He couldn't possibly have an entry in clubs, not only in hearts. Holding king, jack and 10 of hearts, nothing could prevent you from winning a heart trick and with two more spade stoppers, you had plenty of time."

"There you go using absolutes again, Champion," smiled Mr. Dale. "Don't say 'nothing' could prevent 'him. Something did, Muzzy himself."

As cellist, Silva was the most dramatic and frequently the most effective of the three. In the deep, ominous passages of the "Sonata in B Flat Major" for cello and piano by Boccherini, which he arranged, his performance was outstanding as he ran the gamut of the rich tones of his instrument.

His performance in his encore selection of "Valses Nobles et Sentimentals" by Schubert was also warmly received.

The newcomer to the group, Urban, filled the violinist role with sensitive musicianship. While his solo in the Sonata in G Major for violin and piano by Grieg was well played, he showed himself at his best in duo selections with Silva. Notable among these was his part in the "Cradle Song" by Glere.

In "Perpetuum Mobile," also by Glere, he and Silva produced one of the outstanding performances of the evening.

The closing selection, "Trio in A minor" by Tchaikowsky, showed the three performing together with particular brilliance and several moments passed after the conclusion before the spell on the audience was broken.

After the concert a well-attended reception was held by the Civic Centre Concert Auxiliary to introduce the musicians informally to the audience.

During this pleasant period Robert Harlow, of CBC had recorded interviews with the artists which will be a part of a forthcoming broadcast on Prince Rupert.

An added artistic feature of the evening was a display of paintings by Victor Amadio who is presently in Prince Rupert and plans shortly to give a brief painting course here for those interested. His pictures will remain on display at the Centre for another week.

The 600 people who attended the concert is considered a record audience to any Alaska Music Trail performance here, now in its third season.
