### RUSSIAN PRIESTS ARE BOBBING THEIR HAIR

Patriarchal Appearance of Clergy Gives Place to Modern Fashion

MOSCOW, Dec. 22.—Russian priests are bobbing their long hair after the fashion of the American girls. Some of them are also discarding their beards.

This is done for reasons of hygiene and convenience, but more particularly to render their appearance on the street less conspicuous. For among atheistic Bolsheviks a priest is looked upon with disdain. Formerly members of the Russian orthodox clergy wore long flowing hair which fell loosely over their shoulders, giving them a patriarchal appearance. Many of them cultivated bushy whiskers which reached almost to their waists.

Ever since the Soviet government separated the Church from the State, large numbers of priest and bishops have been discarding their clerical robes and scrapping their high conical black hats. They found if they wore their ecclesiastical garb they could secure neither employment or recognition.
