

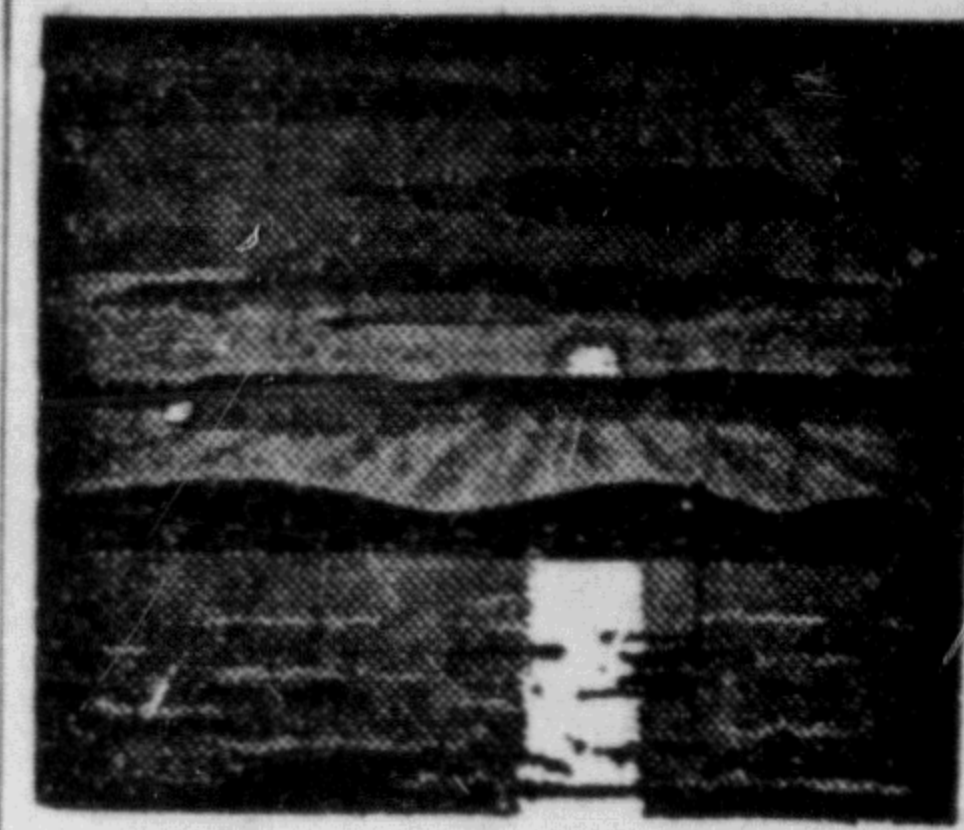

## WATERFRONT - WHIFFS

The lull in the fishing industry caused by the current strike of fishermen is keeping the waterfront quiet, but in certain sections a different kind of fisherman is often seen trying to "get his catch."

With the Rod and Gun Club salmon derby (and allied fish) in full swing, on nearly every float on the waterfront can be seen an angler or two trying for the elusive prize winner.

Jim Bacon, president of the Rod & Gun Club however says enthusiasm for the derby is slow.

I don't know what is the matter with Prince Rupert sportsmen. There are very good prizes—many in the \$30 class and even higher—yet

there's hardly anyone going out to fish compared to the number of anglers in the city."

Another derby committee member had this to say: "I think the people of Prince Rupert are too well fed, and I think they are too lazy to enter such a sporting competition."

Cargo boats are becoming more like passenger liners. For example, the new "Loch Gowan" of the Royal Mail Line will be equipped with a handsome tiled swimming pool.

This is to be a 10,000-ton freight ship with customary accommodation for 12 passengers. This is called a freighter, but the craft deserves to be known as a "super" class sort of boat. Rooms and cabins are to be more roomy. There will be dozens of little comforts and conveniences never before seen.

The fog horn blowing from Holland Rock is described as a new type. A remote controlled diaphone installation it is run by radar from the Barret Rock lighthouse by the lightkeeper. The horn is heard, after pressing of a button. This is said to be the only such installation in Canada, having been especially designed for this port by the National Research Board.

The Naas river salmon gill-net area was recently revised to include waters previously excluded. This includes Steamer Passage, Nasoga Gulf, Khutzmateen Inlet, Union Bay, Wales Passage, Wark Canal, Observatory Inlet, Portland Canal and Tongass Passage.

A strike of between six and seven hundred piledriver operators was avoided recently in Vancouver when they voted to accept a ten cent wage increase offered by heavy construction contractors. This brings journeymen's wages to \$2.15 an hour.

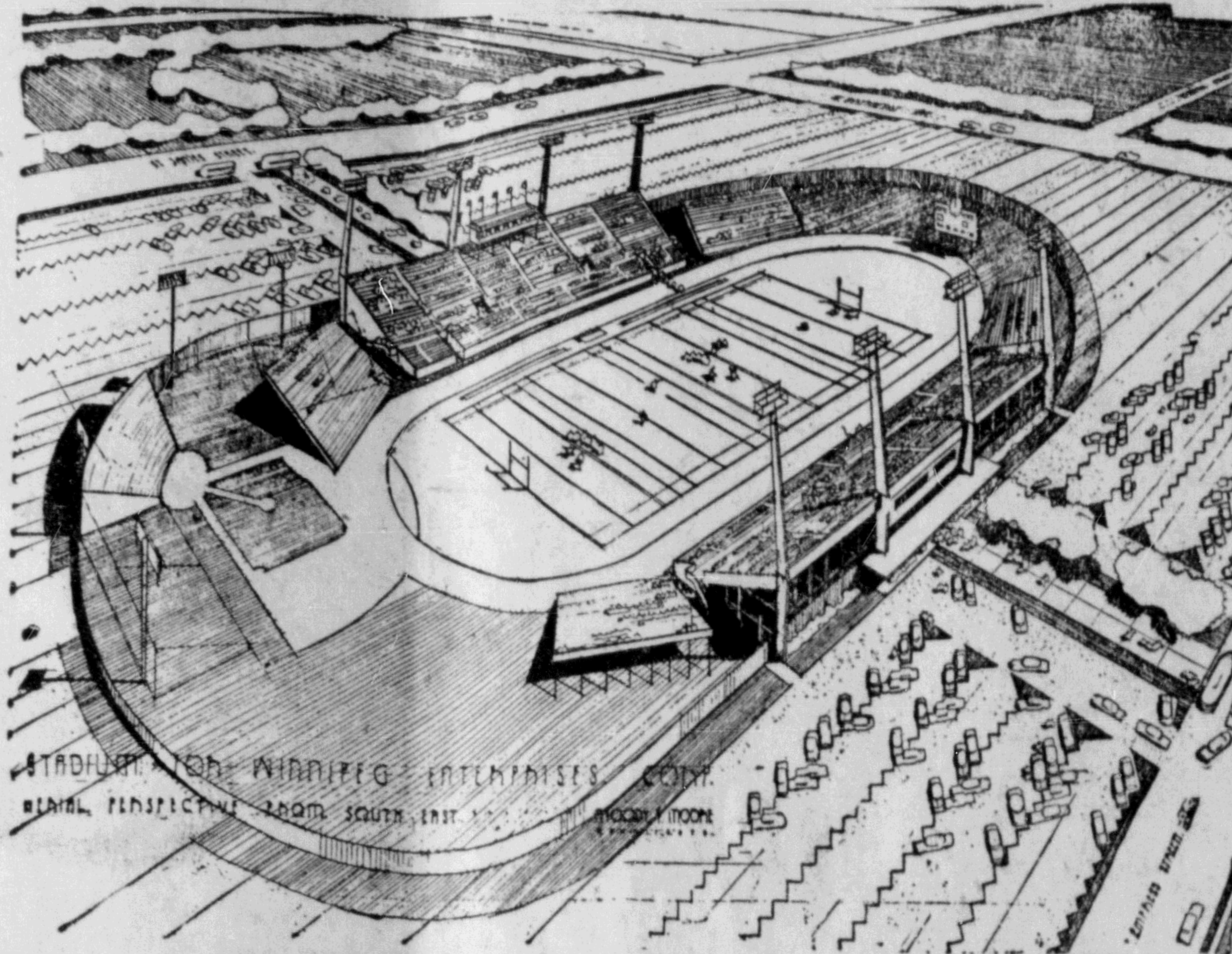

### Yanks Win American Flag With 11th Inning Rally

PHILADELPHIA—The New York Yankees won their fourth straight American League pennant last night with an 11th inning rally that beat the Philadelphia Athletics 5-2.

The victory gave the Yankees their 19th championship in 32 years—the most times any major league team has won the flag.

Johnny Sain, 34-year-old righthander who pitched the Boston Braves to the National League pennant in 1948 was the winning hurler. He pitched 2½ innings of scoreless relief after squelching a Philadelphia threat in the bottom of the ninth.

The Yanks won the game when Billy Martin cracked a two-out, bases-loaded single in the top of the 11th.

Harry Byrd, brilliant rookie righthander who went all the way, was charged with the loss.

The victory gave Manager Casey Stengel of the Yankees the distinction of leading his team to four straight pennants, previously accomplished only by Joe McCarthy and John McGraw.

McCarthy piloted the Yankees to flags in 1936-37-38 and 39.

McGraw steered the New York Giants to pennants in 1921-22-23 and 24. Stengel is the first manager ever to win four in a row in his four years with the club.

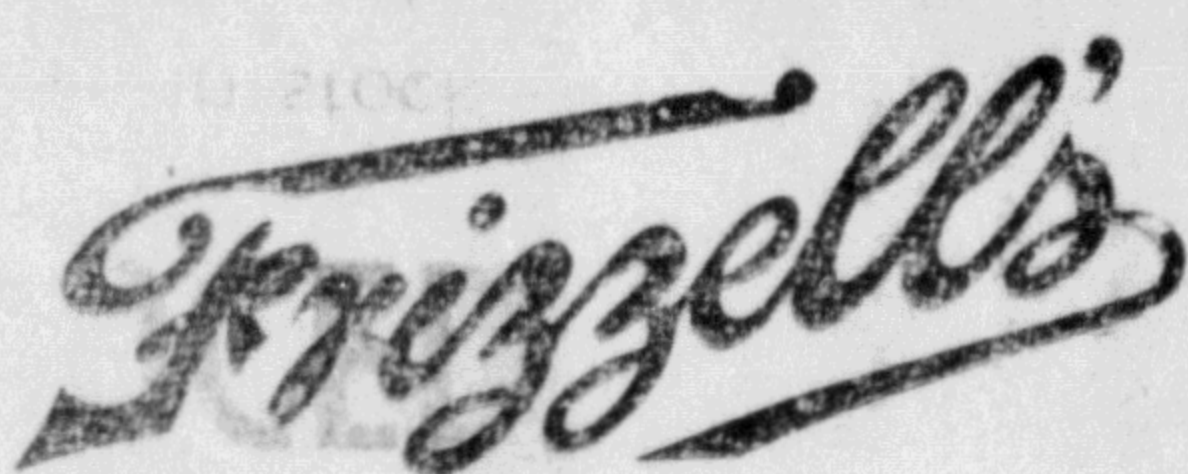
