Mr. Stewart said he believed Canada could absorb 200,000 agrarian settlers each year and efforts would be made to secure that many.

## Sporting Offer Made to Employer by Girl Before Shooting Self

Suggested that if he would not run away with her they should both commit suicide

VANCOUVER. Dec. 15 .- The coroner's jury investigating the death of Jessie Rose found that she shot herself in the office of her employers, Davidson, Wright, Ltd., while temporarily insane.

Evidence showed that the girl had made what she called a "sporting proposition" to A. C. Wright that they both commit suicide and that he refesed to entertain the proposition. Shortly afterwards the girl killed herself.

Wright swore that his relations with the girl, while admiltedly intimate, had always;
