## RAIL TIE-UP AND MARKET

Both Supply and Distribution is Being Seriously Affected by Trouble in Interior

The tie-up on the railway is having a serious effect on local retail business. Supplies from the East are interrupted and distribution to the interior is, of course, interfered with. Butter is short in the city and a supply had to be brought from Vancouver this week. Other lines of produce are also affected.

It is questionable if Christmas turkeys will be delivered here by rail and it is possible they may have to come by way of Vancouver. Turkeys will sell here this season at 40c or 45c a pound. They do not seem such a luxury here as in Seattle where 65c a pound is being asked.

Poultry is scarce and No. 1 roasting chicken is bringing a higher price than turkey. Geese and ducks will be here in time for Christmas and will sell from 32c to 35c per pound.

With a more plentiful supply of fresh eggs, the price of eggs has now started on its usual seasonal decline.

The flour market is holding steady although there has been advance since the last report. The future is uncertain. A general advance in feed lines is recorded this week.

With the arrival of the new crop of navals, the price of oranges, which has been unusually high during the fall, is now starting on a welcome decline.
