Various Matters of Interest to City Taken up at Recent

Mayor Newton presented the dlowing report to the city ouncil last night on his attendince at the western conference:

The attendance, though · not quite as large as anticipated, was thoroughly representative. so much so that a permanent erganization was effected, with the intent of future meetings being held as circumstances war-

As might be expected, the chief aim of this first gathering was that of formulating policies which would unite the four west-Jern provinces so as to speak as one in more energetically pressing for much greater western consideration, both as to general development as well as the removal of such barriers as are felt to be unjust as between the western and eastern portions of Canada.

The conference also went on record as demanding the removal of the permit system for grain shipments to the Bacific, as the present system was deemed to work along the line of forcing grain shipments eastward, where no such system prevails, to the disadvantage of the Pacific outlets, such as Prince Rupert will become as soon as the elevator is in operation.

Much time was spent over the Peace River situation and notwithstanding the fact that the premier of Alberta addressed the onference and stressed the improbability at the present time of a direct railway outlet from the Peace to the Pacific, the conference, unanimously, took the contrary view, and called for the immediate building of the line to the most practical coastal outlet.

Western Railways

There was a divergence of opinion with respect to the completion of the Hudson's Bay Railway, but, finally, its completion was endorsed, from the viewpoint of giving northeastern Saskatchewan and northern Manitoba the same shorter grain outlet via Hudson's Bay as the western prairies could possess via Prince Rupert and Vancouver.
