NEW YORK (AP)—Far be it from an old National League partisan to offer false hope to fellow sufferers of recent years, but this might possibly be the World Series where we give those American Leaguers their lumps.

**Harold Thom
Takes Trophy
In Trap Shoot**

Harold Thom, vice-president of Prince Rupert Rod and Gun Club holds the Northern and Interior B.C. trap-shooting championship following the shoot-off at Terrace last Sunday.

Shooting 23 clays out of 25, Thom beat out 22 other competitors for the individual trap-shooting trophy which is currently displayed at Cook's Jewellers.

Terrace Rod & Gun Club, however with two strong teams took away the club trophy shooting 107 and 114 with two seven-man teams. Prince Rupert team scored 89 with one team which the city club president Jim Bacon said "was not a very good representation" from Prince Rupert sharpshooters.

Runner-ups to Thom for the individual cup were George Robinson, of Prince Rupert and Cecil Blackburn, of Terrace, each with 20 out of a possible 25.

As Manager Charles Dressen of our glorious Dodgers so aptly points out, they can be licked—it's just that they haven't been lately.

We've been looking over the Dodgers' record for the season and are struck by a number of things which might bring cheer, the principal one of which is the strong indication that they no longer roll over and play dead when the going gets rough, but get rough, themselves.

The last time our champions were out west, you may recall, St. Louis Cardinals were hotter than a depot stove and were threatening to move right in on the leaders. The Dodgers knocked them off four straight, and you never heard of Eddie Stanky's team again.

Then they went into that five-game series with the Giants, when people were yelling that the panic was on again. They dropped the first two at the Polo Grounds, all right, but came back swinging to take two of the next three and ease the pressure to the vanishing point. They bashed the Phillies to win the pennant.

In other words, while it is true that our heroes built up the great lead they held late in August at the expense of the stragglers, it is equally in evidence that they refused to fold here in the last few weeks when the he-wolves were howling around their door.

HOPEFUL SIGN

That is, perhaps, the most hopeful sign. For another thing, the Dodgers were remarkably consistent when one considers the confused state of their pitching for much of the season. Maybe they don't have any pitching, as some American Leaguers claim, but somebody must have ben out there with that rosin bag.

The Dodgers were in the lead or were tied for the top on all but 16 days of the race. They held undisputed possession of first place from June 1 on. They never were more than 2½ games off the pace, having trailed the Giants by that margin May 28. They held their longest lead, 10½ games, on August 25 and 26.

As a fitting reward for having knocked their league opponents bowlegged, Dressen's stalwarts enter the series fully rested and loaded, one presumes, with home runs. That will be a lot different from the last three years when our boys staggered into the series bery-eyed from winning out on the last day or in a playoff. The Yanks won't be the fat cats this time.

mon's wanderings. But they admit the job will be difficult.

In 1913 the B.C. sockeye catch was 648,586 cases of 48 pounds each while all other species totalled 47,463 cases. The total catch had a value of about \$7,000,000 at that time.

In the cyclic year of 1937 the sockeye catch was down to 325,774 cases but the catch of all other species—because of commercial education and demand—had risen to 1,183,401 cases.

Last year's sockeye catch was 428,299 cases with a market value of \$15,990,371 while all other species totalled 1,528,097 cases worth \$31,377,545.
