## Number of Registrations Presages Large Vote at the Forthcoming Federal Election

There is every promise of a large vote at the forthcoming federal election, judging from the large number of registrations. J. C. McLennan, who has charge of the registrations here, assisted by J. O. Williamson, announced this morning that they had placed 668 names on the list for the City of Prince Rupert since they commenced, and 200 of them registered yesterday. This is in addition to those who were already on the provincial voters list, which is used as a base.

The registration office in the Westenhaver Block is open until nine o'clock tonight when it closes finally. From August 24 to August 30, a court of revision will sit to revise the list, Norman Watt being revising officer.
