KING EXPLAINS CUSTOMS EVENT

Shows Clearly That Incident Made Much of By Detractors Was Flimsy.

VANCOUVER, Aug. 11—Premier Mackenzie King, in showing to what extremes the Conservatives went in manufacturing campaign material to try to oust the Liberals and later to retain power, told the incident in which the late Hon. George Boivin figured.

"It was brought to his attention during his campaign when he dropped into his office one day, that a certain man had been convicted of an offense against the customs law. Mr. Boivin was asked to defer issuing a warrant of commitment for the arrest of this man until the member for that constituency should have a chance to discuss the matter with him.

Being new to his department and new to the procedure which had been followed in the past, Mr. Boivin asked his deputy minister to advise him. The deputy minister was a Conservative appointee. He was told by the deputy minister it was a perfectly right thing to do to wait and hear what was to be said before taking any action on the warrant. He said, 'Hold this matter over until I have time, after the election, to take it up and have a word with the member.'

No Reason Why "Although it had been hoped the session would commence in December, it was early in January before Parliament met. That was the first chance Mr. Boivin had to discuss the matter with the member.

"He discussed it then and said he could see no reason why that man should not be committed. Even when the matter was first brought to his attention he said, 'I see no reason why this man should not go to jail at once, but I will wait and see the member.' Later he said nothing had occurred to change his opinion. Thereupon he issued the warrant, the man was put in jail and is in jail at the present time.

Fish Arrivals

Halibut arrivals at this port during the past week (Saturday to Friday, inclusive) amounted to a total of 781,500 pounds, which is 93,500 pounds in excess of the previous week's landings when the total was 638,000 pounds. Of the 781,500 pounds sold this week the Americans landed 518,000 pounds and the Canadians 263,500 pounds.

The landings at this port for the season to date total 16,959,500 pounds—12,005,100 pounds from American vessels and 4,954,400 pounds from Canadian vessels.

ISLANDS SERVICE DURING FAIR WEEK

The following boat schedule has been arranged by the Canadian National Steamships through the fair board for the accommodation of visitors from the Queen Charlotte Islands during exhibition week. This will permit of island visitors voting at home and later visiting the city for the fair.
