Some names hardly ever get into the headlines of the newspapers because they do not lend themselves to that purpose. They are usually too long. Take as an instance the words "Board Trade" or "League of Nations." They are too long for the common 30 point single column headline which is the one most used in this newspaper and consequently they cannot well be used. The words "Players' Club," however, just fits and when that organization has some doings, the name usually comes in the headline. This shows that a great many things have to be considered in choosing a name. It also indicates what small things sometimes influence results.
