

# EMPLOYEES TO

ALLEGED UNAUTHORIZED ACTION OF DEPARTMENT IS RIGHTED BY CITY COUNCIL

There was considerable discussion last night's council meeting on matter of adjustments that had been made in connection with the wages of employees of the public works department. Apparently some men, after heavy street work had been completed, were set back from strawbosses to laborers and accordingly reduced in wages, other employees not having to do with street work being similarly reduced. Ald. Casey and other members of the council felt that the department had been out of order in reducing wages of the Board of Works, held that it was not a matter of reducing wages but was a reorganization of the department.

It was decided that the salary of J. Joy, driver of the nightsoil truck, be restored to \$158 per month; that Jack McRae, city foreman who had been reduced to strawboss, be paid \$6 per day instead of \$5, he formerly having received \$7 per day, and that the pay of George Ferguson, in charge of plank road repairs, and Mike Lubotina, the waterworks department, be \$5 per day instead of \$4.60.
