sewers for your consideration. A number of reports together with plans have been made by different enineers but have been too extensive for a city this size to undertake. So I have evolved a solution by a system which utilizes a steel pipe sewer eighteen inches in diameter for the outlet contiguous to Hay's Creek which area is bounded by

a red line on the accompanying map. To make this report without going to the expense of a survey I have based BENT'S by computations on the data compiled by previous engineers and which is on lile in this office. Until this report is approved I see no necessity for further by computations on the data compiled approved I see no necessity for further

expenditure in this regard. This size of pipe laid to grade will take care of this section indicated above for many years. When the city grows to the extent that this pipe is too small then a set of duplicate electrically driven pumps may be added to pump the sewage through this outlet or another pipe may be constructed as seen fit at the time. By this method a system can be built up from year to year without any very large capital outlay during any one year. For this reason, too, I recommend that storm water be

taken care of separately. Branch sewers can be constructed from this trunk line by the local improvement plan initiated by the council or by petition from time to time as occasion

may warrant their construction. Such an outlet could be built for approximately \$35,000, and then practically the whole settled portion of the city will have equal sewer facilities.

The report of the engineer, which was accompanied by a recommendation from the Board of Works that the report be adopted and the work proceeded with, stated that the forms had never been removed from the dam and, before any \$400 or \$500.
