## CHANGES IN SPELLING OF MANY WORDS ASKED FOR SIMPLIFICATION

NEW YORK, June 3.—Changes in spelling of 30,000 words are needed to make the English language phonetic, the simplified spelling board reports. The board advocates one spelling for each of the 43 sounds in the language, instead of 7.8 spellings per sound for consonants and 18.6 for vowels, now in use.

A committee was selected to join a delegation from Great Britain in a conference at the Sesquicentennial celebration in Philadelphia to make English an international language.
