Cabinet Plans Non-Permanent Labor Board

VICTORIA (CP)—Formation of a non-permanent labor relations board, similar to many other Canadian provinces, is under active consideration by the provincial government.

The government's desire for a non-permanent board is prompted by two hopes:

1. Considerable monetary saving, and 2. settlement of more disputes by conciliation.

If a non-permanent LRB is formed, the government would build up its conciliation services, placing more emphasis on advisability of settling disputes at conciliation level.

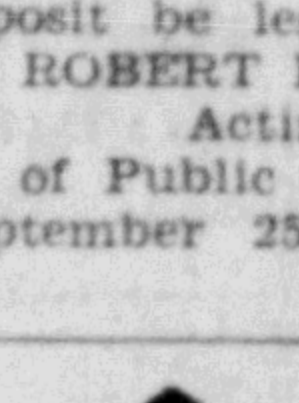
