Production in Canada Makes Big Gain Over Previous Year

OTTAWA, July 7 .- Total value of the fisheries production in Canada for the year 1925 was 847,926,802 compared with 844,-531,235 in 1924. The figures represent the value of fish marketed in British Columbia as first among the provinces, with a product valued at \$22,414,618. Value production in the Yukon and on the prairies was \$2,120,-458, in Nova Scotia \$10,213,687 New Brunswick \$4,798,589, On tario \$3,436,412, Quebec \$3,014, 919 and Prince Edward Island, 81,598,119.
