STEAMER SANK

RIO DE JANEIRO, Aug. 5.—Twenty-six people were drowned when the North Brazilian Ports sank after colliding with a pontoon near the Bay of Araras.

The collision occurred during the darkness last night. Reports received from Para, where several of the survivors, including Captain Mato have arrived, say five of the drowned belonged to the crew and the remainder were passengers.
