season on the halibut schooner Helen which is now tied up for the winter.
Capt. Jim Batt returned this week from Lagoon Bay where he was packing salmon with his halibut boat Fanny F. which is being tied up for the winter.

BOATS ARE TYING UP
The past week has seen several more of the smaller halibut boats tied up for the winter and now there are none but the larger boats continuing fishing until the season closes on November 15, two weeks hence. There is considerable difference of opinion as to whether or not there may yet be a heavy volume of landings at this port but it is certain that the total landing here will be at least a little under last year's total. It is expected that a number of the big American schooners will not call here again this year but will go direct home to headquarters in Seattle with their last catches. Keeping weather is good and a day or so more or less now does not affect the quality of the fish.

Well up to average, halibut landings at the port during the past week (Saturday to Friday inclusive) totalled 770,900 pounds of which American bottoms landed 744,900 pounds and Canadian, 26,000 pounds. The high price of the week was paid yesterday to the Canadian schooner Morris H. which got 16.8c and 10c from the Canadian Fish & Cold Storage Co. for a catch of 7,000 pounds. The lowest price, 14.1c and 8c, was paid for American halibut a week ago today.

The landings this week bring the total for the season to date to 24,793,800 pounds which is a long call, with only two weeks fishing to go, to last year's total of 28,920,700 pounds. American boats have so far this year landed 24,793,800 pounds and Canadian, 6,135,100 pounds.

American—Alten, 35,000 pounds; Grant, 34,000; Thor, 44,000; Daly, 26,000; Kanaga, 50,000; Constitution, 40,000; Havana, 42,000; Grayling, 7,000; Hazel H., 13,000; Jack, 400; Western, 43,000; Arrow, 35,000; Bonanza, 19,000; Orient, 23,000; Explorer, 35,000; Majestic, 24,000; Radio, 43,000; Wizard, 42,000; Eureka, 6,000; Kodiak, 31,000; Brothers, 7,500; Seymour, 43,000; Foremost, 25,000; Seattle, 28,000; Marmot, 23,000; Lituya, 13,000.
Canadian—Gibson, 5,000; Rose Spit, 1,000; Dolphin, 3,000; White Lily, 1,200; Cape Swain, 3,500; N. & S., 1,600; Verma, 2,500; Morris H., 7,000; Yule, 1,200.
