EFFORT MADE TO SECURE LOWER RATES ON RAILWAY TO PACIFIC COAST PORT

EDMONTON, Nov. 4.-Lower freight rates on coal for the coast market will be taken up at once by C.N.R. officials while he intends to arrange for a meeting of operators in order to make strong representations for a reduction. stated Mayor K. A. Blatchford on his return from Vancouver.

The mayor stated that he had conference at Jasper with W. A. Kingsland, general manager of C.N.R. western lines, and other railway officials. At this time he showed the need of a cut in rates and feels that there are good chances of the railway absorbing switching charge of 20 cents a ton that | dealers now have to face.

It is felt that the C.N.R. should agree to this as the charge is absorbed by the C.P.R. and Great Northern when coal is shipped to Vancouver over their ines from the Crowsnest Pass district.

Fully 50,000 tons could be shipped to the coast market this year under favorable conditions while there is a potential market of 500,000 tons a year in greater Vancouver, says the mayor. Shipments over the C.N.R. now cost \$4.10 per ton, inclusive of switching by the B.C. Electric railway. If the gross rate was reduced to \$.50 per ton it is felt that a big coal market could be developed at the coast.

Big coal bunkers are to be provided at Vancouver by a private company which is to be a common carrier and which has made arrangements with the harbor board for a lease of centrally located property, says the mayor.
