BLACKWOOD on Bridge

Finesse Is Easy—Easy To Muff, That Is
Mr. Muzzy contends there is one play in bridge

he knows all about—and that's the finesse. If that were true he would be the world's greatest player because this apparently simple play is often one of the most difficult and intricate of all.

There is more to it than merely leading up toward an ace-queen and playing the queen when second hand plays low.

There are such questions as these to decide: With finessing positions in several suits, which do you finesse first? How deep should your finesse be? Should you abandon an available finesse entirely and try for some other play—an end-play or a squeeze?

When should you take a finesse early in a hand and when should it be deferred until the last possible moment?

Nobody can answer all those questions right all the time. But you CAN learn what the odds are in various situations and then play with those odds in your favor.

Today's hand is a simple one but Mr. Muzzy might have muffed it. Look at the spade and heart suits. The odds are 3 to 1 that Mr. Abel will not hold both king and jack of spades. Proper play is to finesse spades twice.

On the first lead which card should you finesse, the 10 or the queen? The 10, because you plan to finesse twice anyway, and if BOTH king and jack are on your right, you may get away with no spade losers at all.

The ODDS are also 3 to 1 that Mr. Keen does not hold both king and jack of hearts. But the play here is to finesse the queen, not the 10, because there are only two hearts in the South hand and there is no sense taking any more risk than necessary.

tract. Mr. Abel won the first two tricks with high clubs and led a third club. Dummy ruffed and led a spade.

Mr. Dale put in the 10 and it lost to the jack. Dummy won the diamond return and the finesse of the queen of spades was successful. The ace of trumps picked up the king and the finesse of the queen of hearts assured 10 tricks.
