> 5. No publication ,either relitendencies in favor of religion, SPEAKER'S CHAIR may comment on national political affairs.

6. No organization may be formed whose title has any word or any indication that it is connected with religious ideas.

7. Political meetings may no be held in churches.

8. All religious acts must be held with the walls of a church. No religious order of any may possess or administer

10. The churches are the property of the nation. Other ecclesiastical properties, such as bishops' palaces, houses, seminlaries, asylums, colleges, convents and all buildings constructed for religious purposes, pass into the possession of the nation, the use to which they are to be put to be determined by the government.

11. Heavy penalties may be imposed upon ministerial or other authorities who fail to enforce the above provisions.


