Runic Story Read by Archaeologist Tells of Battle in Which Visitors Lost

SPOKANE, July 19 .- Discovery of another group of runes dated 1010, A.D., describing Norsemen swimming across the Columbia to escape from Indians has been revealed here by Prof. Oluf Opsjon in connection with his invitation to archaeololists to investigate such markings found in this

The story of how eight of 16 Vikings crossed the river tell safety and then starved beneath the river cliffs where they sought refuge from Indians, was told by the author of numerous Norse history articles, who last Monday announced the discovery of runic inscriptions near here.
