

13 Members of British Parliament Suspended Obstructing Business

LONDON, April 15 .- Thirteen Labor members of Parliament were suspended during an all-night sitting of the House of Commons for wilfully obstructing business. Hon. Neville Chamberlain named the offenders and moved their suspension, which was carried on a vote of 163 to 76. Thereupon they withdrew from the House.

The trouble arose when J. H. Thomas at six o'clock moved the adjournment of the debate on the Economy Bill and the Laborites obstructed the taking of the vote.

Although the Vancouver Pro-· vince last Sunday gave prominrence to special despatch from Ottawa stating that there was to be a slashing reduction of the Jericho Beach air station equipment and personnel which would eliminate an aerial fisheries patrol service here this summer, Adam Mackie, the local inspector of fisheries, has received no word that there is to be no such patrol. In fact, arrangements were made during the winter for an even more extensive patrol than last year and the planes are expected to arrive from the south
