## Incredible Human Parade Crowds Idlewild Airport

NEW YORK (AP)—New York International Airport is a way station for an incredibly varied human procession.

This, the largest commercial airport in the world, mixes the flavors of Grand Hotel, front page and 'Hellzapoppin'. In its moods, sights, sounds, contrasting flavors, it ranges from high international drama to slow comedy.

From the excitement of a returning MacArthur to the pathos of a frightened displaced person looking for a friendly face... from striped-pants foreign ministers trying to escape the press with no comment to movie queens trying to capture the press with leg art... from handcuffed deportees reluctant to leave the country to zoo elephants reluctant to enter...

It has the roar of Super-Constellations coming in from London or Lisbon... the breadth of a field big enough to cover one-third of Manhattan Island... the frontier-like atmosphere of Quonset huts still in use at the expanding terminal and washrooms marked "men, messieurs, caballeros"...

The incongruity of a fezzed Moslem puzzling over a headline in a New York tabloid... the tense uncertainty of shawled refugees walking through the last customs gate.

The backdrop is seven square miles of filled-in marshland at Idlewild, Queens. The field is so

big that the new, 11-story control tower, in addition to all the usual electronic devices for guiding planes in the air, now has a special radar system to direct aircraft, jeeps, trucks on the ground.

They need such gadgets here. One pilot coming in from London flew the Atlantic safely and smoothly. He had no difficulty until he landed at one end of Idlewild and couldn't find the terminal building three miles away.

Underground, Idlewild has drainage pipes big enough for a subway train to run through. On the ground, it has seven huge runways. The longest is 9,500.

The field has a fuel storage capacity of 4,000,000 gallons. It uses so much gasoline that bringing the stuff in overland

might tie up road traffic. So tankers deliver the fuel by sea, unloading at the airport's own docks in Jamaica Bay.

It cost \$100,000,000 to build Idlewild, took six years and they're not finished yet. Many of the present buildings are temporary. New York City started the original job in 1942 and struggled through 12 different changes in the master design. Finally, the port of New York authority, an inter-state agency, took over in 1948 and opened the field that year.

Today, Idlewild handles about 8,000 passengers and 350 flights a day. It is still less than a load at La Guardia but Idlewild rapidly is closing the gap, especially since much of Newark's traffic was diverted there.

## Whooping Cough Deadly For Younger Children

Poular opinion to the contrary, whooping cough is one of the deadliest of childhood diseases. Among children under the age of two it takes a higher toll of life than polio, diphtheria, measles and scarlet fever combined. This startling fact is pointed out by the Health League of Canada as proof of the need

for immunization.

"Of the various infectious diseases encountered today, whooping cough presents the chief problem from the standpoint of reduction in mortality," a spokesman for the National Immunization Week committee of the Health League states.

"It is in the younger age group that high mortality in whooping cough occurs. Eighty-five to 90 per cent of deaths from this disease occur before the third year of life, and more than half of the total whooping cough deaths occur in infants under one year."

The Health League, which this year is sponsoring its tenth annual National Immunization Week, Oct. 12-18, stresses that whooping cough vaccine must be administered early in life (by six months of age or even earlier) if it is to do the most good. And recall or booster doses must be administered during preschool years to maintain immunity through this dangerous period.

To make protection easier for both parents and children, a combination of whooping cough vaccine and diphtheria and lockjaw toxoid can now be given either by the family doctor or at public health clinics.

"It is the clear duty of every parent to see that no child runs the needless risk of death from one of these preventable diseases," declares Dr. Gordon Bates, general director of the Health League of Canada. "In-difference on the part of parents to the need for immunization is nothing short of criminal neglect!"
