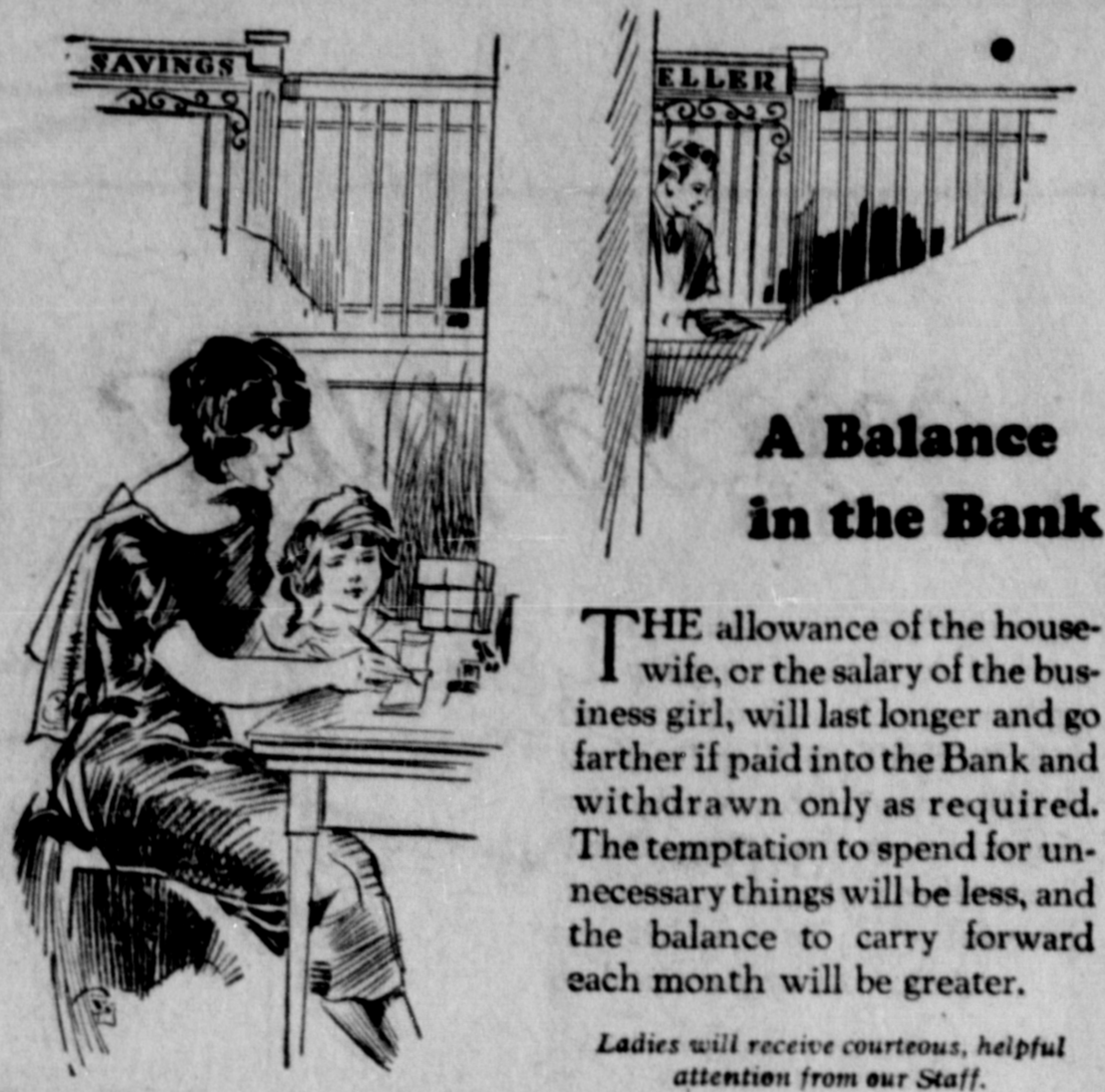

**SALMON PACK ALASKA LARGE COSTS 3 CENTS SELLS FOR 35**

JUNEAU, Sept. 4. — Figures made public here place the Alaska salmon pack this year at 6,245,000 cases.

Many canneries will resume fishing at the expiration of the six weeks closed season, which is in progress in southeastern Alaska, which includes Juneau and Ketchikan. This district leads others with 2,800,000 cases.

INVESTIGATION GOING ON

VECTORIA, Sept. 4.—In the course of a semi-official investigation into the high cost of fish in the coast cities, which he is conducting on behalf of Vancouver City Council, Alderman Gibbens arrived here after visiting other Vancouver Island centres.

"The question of high fish costs in our chief cities," said Mr. Gibbens, "is one that has been puzzling the markets committee of the Vancouver Council. Investigation on this island revealed the fact that fish which sells at 35 cents a pound retail brings the man who catches it three cents a pound. That spread of twelve times what the fisherman gets seems rather big and we in Vancouver are trying to find out what is the cause of it, in view of the fact that we have fish right at the harbor mouth."

On Thursday, September 2, in your editorial you say:

"Prince Rupert people who were born in the United States, Norway, Sweden, Denmark, France, Belgium, Italy, Greece and a dozen other countries would not be allowed to vote if some of the Conservatives had their way."
