CITY ACCEPTS TARVIA TENDER

Barrett Co. Gets Contract for Work on Down Town Streets

A recommendation from the city engineer, that the tender of the Barrett Co., Ltd., Vancouver, for the supply and distribution of tarvia for road maintenance was accepted by the council last night. It was the lowest tender.

The Barrett Co., Ltd. and General Construction Co., Ltd., of Vancouver, were the only firms tendering on the work. The Barrett Co. quoted 23½ cents per gallon on 27,000 gallons of tarvia; 3 cents per gallon for spraying, two men furnished with expenses and board, paid at \$190. Forty per cent of the cost to be paid when the material arrives, forty per cent when the work is completed and the balance in six months.

The question of resurfacing the roads to be sprayed with tarvia came in for a lengthy discussion.

In reply to Ald. Casey as to what work would be done on surface of the roads before the tarvia was put on, Ald. Perry said the holes would be filled up and minor surface work done. The idea was to put a coating of tarvia on the roads and then a light coating of gravel and another coating of tarvia on top.

ENGINEER INSTRUCTED TO START ROAD WORK COUNCIL IS INFORMED

At the meeting of the city council last night a letter was read from the Deputy Minister of Public Works, Victoria, in reply to a letter addressed to the department by the city with reference to the completion of the Kaden Island roadway, stating that District Engineer Mackay had been instructed to undertake the work.

ARCHWAYS DISCUSSED AT COUNCIL MEETING

City Arch Will be Erected at Fulton Street and Fifth Avenue for July 1 Celebration

A letter from the Native Sons of Canada Dominion Day celebration committee asking the city to erect the municipal arch at the crown of the hill on Fulton Street, opposite the Catholic school, was read at last night's council meeting. It was also asked that the city roll down the recreation grounds before the celebration in view of the fact that a number of children's races would be run off on that day.

In reply to a question by Ald. Casey as to the cost of erecting and taking down the archway, Ald. Perry, chairman of the board of works, stated it would cost in the neighborhood of \$30.

After discussion it was decided to accede to the request. The question of taking down the archway on Third Avenue, which was erected in connection with the recent visit of the Shrimers, also came up at the meeting.

Mayor Newton was of the opinion that, if it were to be allowed to stand for a while, something should be done to liven it up in the way of decoration, which he thought could be done at very little expense.

Ald. McKechnie wanted it moved at once, while Ald. J. Greer thought it could well stand until after the Dominion Day celebration.

Upon motion of Ald. Perry, seconded by Ald. W. J. Greer it was decided to leave the matter in the hands of the Board of Works to do what was best in the way of decoration and to leave the archway standing until the fall after the city engineer had examined it as to its safety.

MAKING PICTURE AT JASPER PARK

"The Country Beyond" is Being Entirely Produced There by Fox Corporation

JASPER, June 23.—Jasper, the world's largest national park, is to provide the setting for one of the great moving picture epics of the year, "The Country Beyond" an adaptation from the story of that name by James Oliver Curwood, which is being produced by the Fox Film Corporation under the personal direction of Irving Cummings. The estate which is a very notable one includes such stars as Olive Borden, J. Farrell Macdonald, Ralph Graves, Fred Kohler and Lawford Davidson, as well as a number of others of outstanding ability. Two sections of the park have been chosen by Mr. Cummings as the setting for his play. This morning his company commenced work beside the jade waters of the Lake of Forgiveness, which lies in the shadow of Mount Edith Cavell, one of the most majestic peaks in the Rockies. There and about Jasper Park Lodge on the shore of Lac Beauvert the preliminary work will be carried on until Thursday when the entire company will move by pony trail to Maligne Lake, where the remainder of the picture will be filmed. This work will occupy almost three weeks and it calls for an expenditure of almost a quarter of a million dollars.

Never before has Hollywood come so far north to film a picture. Small scenes in various productions have been made farther north but this is the first time in the history of motion picture industry that a complete screen feature has been produced north of the boundary. The Maligne Lake territory is considered to be the most spectacular section of the Canadian Rockies and it can be reached from Jasper only by a pony trail thirty miles long which at times clings precariously to the side of a mountain with a sheer drop of hundreds of feet below. Over this trail the entire company with all its supplies and paraphernalia must travel to reach its location. To do this the largest pack train that ever moved through the Canadian Rockies is being provided by Major Fred Brewster, noted guide and outfitter of Jasper. Fifty saddle horses and almost two hundred pack horses will be engaged in the work during the entire time the company is no location.

The completed film version of "The Country Beyond" will provide probably the finest advertising the Canadian Rockies have ever received as it is the intention of Mr. Cummings to specialize in scenic effects, with a view to producing a spectacular natural background on a scale never before attempted and which will set a new standard in the motion picture industry.

In addition to being a story of Canada produced in a Canadian setting, additional Canadian atmosphere is lent to the production through the fact, Farrel Macdonald is related to Sir William Macdonald, while Miss Olive Borden claims family connection with Sir Robert Borden former prime minister.

AUTOS COLLIDED ON FULTON STREET

No Serious Results When Vehicles Collided at Sixth Avenue Corner Yesterday

A motor accident, which fortunately was not attended with any serious consequences, occurred at the corner of Sixth Ave. and Fulton Street at 4.25 yesterday afternoon when a Chevrolet sedan car, driven by M. P. McCaffery, and a taxi car, driven by Geo. E. Martin and owned by the 75 Taxi Company, collided. Considerable damage was done to the Chevrolet car and the bus on the taxi was bent.

The Chevrolet was proceeding along Sixth Avenue West and the taxi was going down Fulton when the accident happened.

BOOTLEGGERS IN SILK STOCKINGS REAPING A HARVEST IN ROUMANIA

BUCHAREST, Rumania, June 23.—Bootleggers in silk stockings are reaping fortunes in Rumania. There is a prohibitive duty on silks, lingerie, perfumes and articles "de luxe" generally. But the Rumanian woman, who is the best dressed in the Balkans, demands these articles at any cost.

The result is that bootleggers, many of them women, bring in clandestinely thousands of pairs of Parisian silk hosiery and sell them to the retail stores or direct to users.

Although the government is taking drastic measures against smuggling, the illicit traffic continues.
