# ASK REDUCTION OF PASSENGER FARES IN WEST

VICTORIA, Feb. 5.—Reductions in the present passenger fares on Canadian railways over lines in British Columbia probably will form one of this Province's chief demands when it applies to the Railway Board shortly for a general cut in transportation costs.  
This was indicated by G. G. McGeer, K.C., government rate counsel, when he arrived here for conferences with members of the Government in preparation for Railway Board hearings expected to take place in March or April.  
"Our case will cover every phase of the freight rate situation as well as express rates," Mr. McGeer declared. "We have under consideration now, as well, an application for lower passenger rates."

The Government rate counsel declared that all transportation rates in British Columbia were excessive in comparison with rates on similar commodities in other parts of Canada.  
"The Mountain Rate Scale affects all rates in effect here," he said. "It is against this Mountain Scale that we have been fighting. We are applying for general rate reductions all along the line."

Mr. McGeer added that he had not been informed of the Railway Board's probable date of arrival in British Columbia. He said he did not anticipate any attempt to upset the recent judgment of the board upholding its former decision to equalize Western grain rates.



and world trail blazer in the art of night flying, is on the eve of an expansion which will benefit a large portion of the country.

Within the next few months air mail service will be provided for two score more cities with indirect benefit to other places in a wide expanse of territory. This progressive step has been taken under the law passed last year permitting the Postmaster General to contract with commercial aviation enterprise for the carrying of the mails through the air.

Contracts have been let or have been advertised for a dozen routes. The first to begin service will be the Chicago-Detroit and the Cleveland-Detroit routes on February 15, and by April a majority of these routes are expected to be in operation.



## IMPORTING QUAIL TO HELP FARMERS

TOPEKA, Kan., Feb. 5.—Kansas has found a way to import farm labor without running afoul of the immigration authorities.

The state has just imported 5,000 quail from Mexico to help out the Kansas farmers. They are expected to eat up 125,000 insects during next summer, and with their brood of young "bobwhite" to destroy at least a quarter of a billion weed seeds by autumn.

The Mexican quail is slightly smaller than the native bob white of Kansas, but the state game warden is assured that the two will interbreed. He estimates conservatively that the purchase of 5,000 birds will bring Kansas 25,000 young quail next summer.
