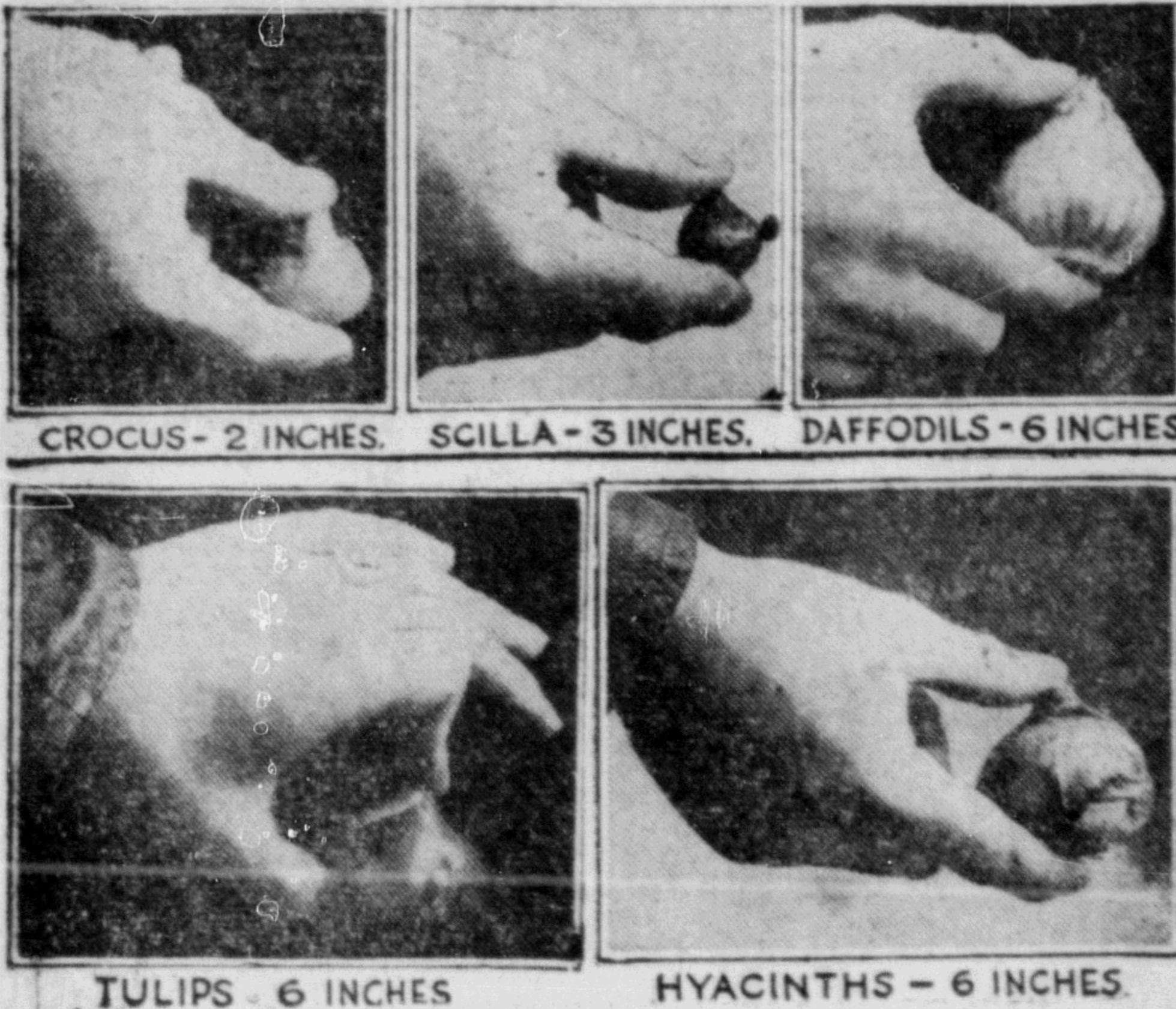


Bulbs Easiest Flowers to Grow And Most Rewarding



Spring flowering bulbs are the easiest of garden flowers to grow because nature has so well equipped them to endure the cold of winter and bloom with the first spring warmth, before insects and weeds have appeared.

The bulb you plant contains food enough to develop its flower provided it is of flowering size. It not only endures winter, but requires a chill to make it flower.

Tulips, intended for growing in the far south, and in greenhouses, are given this chill in cold storage before planting. Growth must begin in the fall, because when the spring thaws comes they begin to bloom not in months, nor weeks, but actually in days.

Many ideas about growing bulbs formerly held, have been discarded as a result of research. One is that bulbs do not need plant food. While the bulb is a storehouse of food for the embryo within, experience has demonstrated that more vigorous growth and larger flowers will be produced if the soil is enriched by commercial plant food when the bulbs are planted.

The greatest enemy of bulbs is dampness. To assist drainage it is sometimes the practice to put sand beneath each bulb. This is a useless measure. If you must plant in a spot where water stands long after it has been drained from the rest of the garden, elevate a bed as high as necessary to insure drainage, and plant your bulbs there.

In average soil, plant snowdrops, scillas, chionodoxas, with three inches of soil above them. Grape hyacinths should have four inches of soil over them. Most lilies should be planted with 4 to 6 inches of soil over them and hyacinths and narcissi need six inches covering. Tulips which are intended to be lifted from the ground each spring, and replanted in the fall, may be planted at the same depth as narcissi. But if they are not to be lifted, but left in the ground for several years, deep planting, 10 to 12 inches down, is recommended.

The reason for this deep planting is that it prevents the formation of several small bulbs to replace the one you plant, bulbs too small to flower the following year.

Bulbs planted after mid-October should always be covered with a heavy mulch to prevent the ground from freezing before root growth can begin. Bulbs which are frozen before growth starts may be prevented from growing, and lie dormant or decay during the winter. A mulch will delay freezing and permit the necessary root growth.

Wild Horses Roam Northern Alberta Hills

EDMONTON — Some 1,500 wild horses are reported roaming northern Alberta in four main bands and damaging crops. One large herd was reported last week playing havoc with crops in the Clear Hills country 250 miles northwest of Edmonton.

Today Livestock Commissioner W. H. T. Mead reported he is also investigating three more large bands in widely-separated parts of northern Alberta.

Mr. Mead will leave tomorrow to look into complaints from farmers about the bands which have strayed from pastures and wild horses that have bred and thrived on the open range.

Information is needed on which to base a fairly-accurate estimate of the number of horses so proper plans can be made to round them up. Then riders would be signed up and corrals built.

Mr. Mead said a second herd of between 500 and 700 horses has been reported in the Frog Lake area near the Alberta-Saskatchewan boundary 150 miles northeast of Edmonton.

A third herd of about 200 horses is reported in the Fort Vermillion region 300 miles northwest of Edmonton. Still to be investigated is a year-old report of a herd in the Lac La Biche district 115 miles northeast of Edmonton.

The livestock commissioner plans to begin his investigations in the Clear Hills area and eventually cover all regions involved in the reports.

Riders taking part in the roundup would be paid from the sale of horses and from fees on branded horses that are claimed.

Navy War Films Released to U.S. For Television

LONDON (Reuters) — Documentary films taken during the Second World War by the Admiralty and War Office, which have never been shown publicly, will soon be seen by U.S. television audiences.

About 50,000 feet of film have been made available to an American network for a 26-episode documentary called "Victory at Sea," beginning Oct. 26. The Canadian and Australian governments also provided material for the documentary.

Careless Smoking Takes Heavy Toll in Lives, Damage

OTTAWA — Exercise of a little care by Canadians last year could have prevented 40,875

fires and property loss of \$21,317,651.

During Fire Prevention Week it is well to impress upon Canadian people the serious consequences that result from fire in the loss of life and property.

In the past 10 years, 534,735 fires in Canada have claimed 4,085 lives, seriously injured 15,000 persons and destroyed property valued at \$540,000,000. In 1951 alone, there were 60,000 fires. They claimed 493 lives and caused property damage of \$76,000,000. Most of the fires—45,000—were in the home.

SHOCKING RECORD

Just think, careless smoking caused 21,395 fires and damage of \$3,509,294. Defective chimneys, flues, stoves, furnaces, boilers, pipes, hot ashes, coals and open fires were responsible for another 11,437 fires and loss of \$8,813,413.

On the human side, 15 persons died in fires as a result of smoking in bed. Sixteen children left alone were lost in fires. Children playing with matches

were responsible for more than 60 deaths.

The fire causes in the home require your attention and this loss of life can be prevented with the application of your care and knowledge of how to protect your property against fire.

NEED FOR INSPECTION

During Fire Prevention Week it is recommended that:

1. All dwellings, public buildings, stores, warehouses, factories, farms, mines and forests be carefully inspected by their occupants and all conditions likely to cause or promote the spread of fire be removed.
2. All theatres, hotels, hospitals and other institutional buildings be inspected and provision made for all changes necessary to protect the occupants in case of fire.

3. Fire drills be held in children in all schools, inmates of all institutions for the employees in all les.

4. Special instruction subject of fire prevention on by the teachers and by cipal officials in the school that such appropriate lit as may be made available distributed to the pupils.

5. Federal, provincial and municipal authorities encourage means of public meeting, press, radio broadcast, prepared motion pictures otherwise to impress upon zens the national importance of protecting life, property, natural resources from fire.

Former Female Doctor Now To Marry His Housekeeper

ABERDEEN (AP)—Dr. Ewan Forbes-Sempill, whose change of sex from female to male was announced last month, posted notice in his parish church that he will marry his housekeeper, Isobel Mitchell.

The 40-year-old doctor used to be known as Elizabeth Forbes-Sempill. On Sept. 12 a newspaper advertisement announced that she now was a male.
