

EXPERT CRITICISM OF PROPERTIES ON PORTLAND FROM FINANCIAL VIEWPOINT

(Northwest Mining Service) STEWART, B.C., (From our Special Field Representative).—The section of the Portland Canal mining division which is attracting most attention at present is the Marmot River district. It has at least three potential mines -Porter-Idaho, Marmot Metals and the High Grade Groups, each of which has been highly commended by geologists and mining men of experience from both the States and Eastern Canada. 1 Many of them have expressed the opinion that all three of these properties stand excellent chances of developing into equally sensational producers with the Fremier mine.

Heretofore, transportation has been almost impossible in that section. Porter-Idaho has struggled on and paid expenses for three years, although the cost of packing ore to tidewater was \$50 a ton. Marmot Metals was not so badly handicapped, but it has had its share, as also the High Grade Group, of transportation difficulties. The latter property is understood to be under option by the Premier, whose engineers examined it, but the owners state that no deal has been made.

Marmot Metals came into the lime-light this summer. It is being methodically developed, and the ode bodies are so consistent in value, volume and formation that the work now in hand should soon demonstrate its great worth.
