The committed men include virtually the entire list of stockholders and officers of the Canadian Consolidated Exporters Corporation which is said to have been the leader in the shipment of contraband liquor from Canada.

The indictments charge conspiracy to violate the National Tariff Act, and are the result of investigations which federal prohibition agents say have been under way since last July.
