#### PREVENT DRAIN LAKES INTO MISSISSIPPI RIVER

WASHINGTON, June 5. - A bill to prevent the authorization of diversion of the Great Lakes water into the Mississippi from the Illinois River was approved in committee after an hour of filihuster.
