

With the Anyox production at 40,-000,000 lb. a year and Allenby production at 20,000,000, Granby will have a total output of 60,000,000 lb. copper per annum. If the price is stabilized as expected by the Copper Export Association at 15c per lb., Granby can earn a profit of 5c per lb., or 50 per cent over the cost of production.

The company's earnings have been \$5.06 a share for the first nine months of the year before allowing for depletion and depreciation. With these items provided for, earnings still amount to \$3.00 a share net, and the directors expect to close the year with a net of \$4.00 per share. With production at 60,000,000 lb. copper per annum earnings will be equal to 136 lb. copper per share which, at a profit of 5c per lb., will be equivalent to an earning power of \$6.80 per share. In other words each cent per lb. profit represents an earning power of \$1.36

per share. Some hope of a still further increase in production is expected by shareholders from enlargement of the Allenby mill. It is true the original plans of that mill provided for doubling the capacity to 4000 tons a day; but the
