ABOUT FORTY DIGGING GOLD

NO SENATIONAL RESULTS AT GOLD PAN SAY MINERS HERE

INFLUX NEXT YEAR

Men Brought Gold South With Them on Way to Vancouver

About forty men were engaged in sluicing and panning gold this season on Gold Pan Creek and, while some met with fairly good results, there was nothing sensational about it states Robert Nesbitt who, with Charles Beck, arrived in the city yesterday afternoon from the north where they spent the summer working with the outfit of the original discoverers, William Grady and Hugh Ford. They will spend a few days here before continuing south to Vancouver for the winter. Mr. Grady is still at Telegraph Creek and Mr. Ford has gone in beyond to spend the winter on his trapline. Mr. Nesbitt and Mr. Beck have a good deal of gold with them also has Thomas Mateen who came out with them and who continued on to Vancouver yesterday afternoon. Mr. Nesbitt says that Vickery will be about the only man to remain for the winter at Gold Pan. He will be staying to put down some test holes.

On Palmer Creek, about forty miles northeast of Dease Lake, Hall and Cotter put in a boomer outfit this summer and worked it for a while but then started late in the season and did not get much done. They will continue operations next year. There were a few outfits working around Dease and Thibet Creek but they are just getting started and it will be next summer before there are any appreciable results. Another outfit has been working on the Clearwater which runs into the Stikine about twenty miles below Telegraph Creek.

While there is no reason for a boom or stampede, Mr. Nesbitt expects there will be a larger influx of mining men next year in the Stikine and Dease Lake region.
