Funeral was held here Thursday for an old-time resident fisherman who first began fishing on this coast in 1909.

He was Leonhard (Leo) Bredal Mikelsen Sandvar, 65, who died in St. Paul's Hospital, Vancouver, last Saturday.

Born in Berg, Helgeland, Norway, Mr. Sandvar came to Seattle in 1909, went to Alaska subsequently and arrived in Prince Rupert in 1912, following the fishing industry.

He went to Norway in 1926 where he married, then returned to Prince Rupert where he since lived.

Besides his wife, surviving him are one son, Melvin of this city, and four brothers and five sisters in Norway.

Services were conducted from Grenville Chapel by the Rev. H. O. Olsep, Lutheran Church minister.

Mrs. G. C. Gilker was organist and Mrs. F. E. Anfield sang a solo, "Take My Hand, Precious Lord."

Hymns played were "Nearer My God to Thee" and "Safe in the Arms of Jesus." There was a large congregation and many beautiful floral tributes were offered.

Active pallbearers were Martin Berg, L. Sollien, W. Bussey, Carl Giske, Olaf Clebo and Barney Roald. Honorary pallbearers were Pete Wold, Hans Langholm, Jens Husvik and A. C. Clark.

Burial took place in Fairview cemetery under arrangements of B.C. Undertakers.

"Obvious Play" Is Not Always Best Procedure

One angle which even experienced players have to watch is the tendency to make the obvious play—the play which has turned out well for them on hundreds of previous occasions.

Playing a no trump contract, for example, it is usually best to set up your longest suit first. But that is not always the best procedure. The fine player is continually on the alert to recognize when deviations from "normal" lines of play must be made.

Mr. Abel is a pretty good player but he is often guilty of carelessness and failure to think out each specific problem of play.

In today's deal he got the trey of diamonds opening, played small from dummy and killed Mr. Champion's jack with the ace. He saw that he had two sure winners in the diamond suit, three heart tricks, one spade trick and one club trick—a total of seven.

Now he figured that if he could break the club suit 3-2, he could win three tricks in clubs, bringing the total up to nine. He had a total of eight clubs in his hand and dummy, leaving five for the opponents. By giving up two tricks, he could win three.

This was all very fine, except that in the process the enemy won five tricks in all, defeating the contract. On the lead of the ace and another club, Mr. Dale won the second club and returned a low diamond. Mr. Abel won with the ten and fired another club, losing to the queen. Mr. Champion led back his last diamond and Mr. Dale won two tricks in that suit. On the last diamond, Mr. Champion flashed the eight of spades and a lead to the ace of that suit put the contract down one.

Mr. Abel would have had a better chance if he had gone after spades at trick two, leading a small one from his hand
