WHEAT POOL

Big Organization Has Been of Great Advantage to Number

The betterment of the business conditions of the retail merchant is reflected on the wholesale dealer, Mr. Jarvis added, and wholesale men consider that business is being conducted on a more healthy basis, as it has a tendency to eliminate losses in credit given farmers on their supplies during the year.

Effect Widespread

Mr. Jarvis went on exhaustively! into the steps which led up to the formation of the farmers' co-operative selling agencies and then discussed the effect of the organization on the various businesses. He said that the members of the C. C. M. A. were prone to look on the effects of the wheat! pool on one class of businessthe retail trade, whereas it was reflected in the businesses of mortgage companies for loans on i land; the banks and private individuals for advances; the machine and implement companies! and the retail and wholesale merchant trade.

Investigation, he went on, had revealed the following attitude! by the various business firms toward the wheat pool:

Mortgage Companies-The farmers have been able to retire a considerable portion of their past due indebtedness since the inception of the pool. Prices have been stabilized to a certain extent and the farmer placed in a more favorable position from the loan companies' point of view.

Willing to Co-operate

Banks - At the present time, eight of the larger chartered. banks in Canada are financing the pool itself and generally are showing a willingness to co-operate with the movement.

Machine and Implement Companies .- The implement companies are favoring the pool movement. Payments from the pool are made at a season of the year which enables the farmers to purchase equipment more or less on a eash basis rather than the long term basis which has been in existence for a number of years.

Retail Trade .- It is the general belief that the system of marketing under the pool has had the effect of placing business on a more solid basis, as the initial cash payment and the interim payments during the year have now given the farmer money spread over the year. This is having the effect of increasing the cash sales and enabling merhants to operate at lower cost and to lower prices to compete! with the large mail order houses.

Wholesale Trade

Wholesale Trade .- The condition in the retail trade is reflected with wholesale distributors now assisting merchants by offering goods at prices which enable them to induce the farmers ito spend their money in their home districts. . .

In conclusion Mr. Jarvis said that the pool had-resulted in better collections as the debtors have a certain amount of money due from the deferred payments on wheat sold through the pool, which if distributed, ratably, will give all classes a fair share of the receipts from the proceeds of the sale of the crop.
